




#### **Exploring Colour & Light**

#### **Anti-Bullying Learning Continues**


Since Anti-Bullying week earlier in November, many of the children have continued learning about bullying in Life Skills. The children know and understand how to spot the difference between unkindness and bullying (neither of which is accepted at Vinehall).

#### Bullying is:

- repeated/ongoing;
- deliberate;
- unfair (there is an imbalance of power in some way).

5L has focused on varying forms of discrimination (judging appearances, racism, gender stereotyping, cyberbullying, homophobia and disability) and they had the fun task of creating an Anti-Bullying Snakes and Ladders game based on the listed topics. Our Life Skills lessons have been filled with meaningful conversations, equipping the children to stand up against bullying.
