## **MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD OF PRE-PREP**

## The Importance of Drama

"All the world's a stage, and all the men and women merely players" wrote Shakespeare in his play "As You Like it." Drama can serve as a powerful medium to bring historical events "back to life." Nowhere is this more evident than in Sussex at this time of year; whole communities come together to celebrate and re-enact events from the past, as an array of Bonfire Societies indulge in bewildering traditions, such as the rolling of tar barrels down the streets in Lewes this weekend.

Drama opens the mind and incites a hunger to learn and research by exploring simple, scenario-based tasks. We used drama as a tool to help us understand the events of The Gunpowder Plot in assembly on Monday. William C played Guy Fawkes, with George S taking the role of the King, who was horrified to open a letter from Lord Monteagle (played by Monty C) and learn of a plot to blow up Parliament. Having understood the reason why we now remember and celebrate Bonfire Night every year, we used a variety of props to help us act out the Firework Code, which will play an important role in helping the children to stay safe this November. I was so impressed by how much knowledge the children already had of how to stay safe!

Of course, costumes also play an important role in drama and just before half term Year 2 had tremendous fun dressing up in authentic saris which were 100 years old. (Thank you to Amelie V for loaning us this incredible and precious collection). We used costumes to help us to celebrate Diwali and, by creating a sense of awe and wonder, dressing up can "hook" the children into their learning. So, the next time we quietly think that children are "just dressing up and playing", we need to remember the words of Dr Maria Montessori, who said "Play is the work of the child", and that in drama children use their imagination and creativity, problemsolving and collaborative skills.
