## FOCUS OF THE WEEK - HUMANITIES

Tony Little, who was previously Head of Eton, said that 'young people learn more from each other than they do from adults and ... they learn more outside the classroom than inside the classroom'. Taking him at his word, the Humanities Department has been busy trying to get the children out of the classroom since the beginning of term. The Year 3s got us started with their trip to RHS Wisley, and last week it was the turn of the Year 6s and the Year 7s.

The theme for the Year 6s for this half term is 'Church and State', and the children are learning about how Christianity is integral to Britain's history, informing and shaping our culture, values and identity (RS lessons this term are also focused on Christianity). Last week's visit to Canterbury Cathedral focused on the feud between Henry II and Thomas Becket, and the untimely demise of the latter at the hands of four over-excitable knights. The children enjoyed a tour of the cathedral dressed as various characters from the story, before making their own pilgrim badges in imitation of the badges that were very popular in the late medieval period.

The Year 7s meanwhile are following the theme of 'Conflict', though they discovered on their trip to Battle Abbey that the site brings both 'Conflict' and 'Church and State' together. After hiding from the rain in the visitor centre, the children enjoyed a tour of the school with 'Brother James' before heading down onto the battlefield to recreate the key moments from the battle of Hastings. The children then learnt that, to atone for killing thousands of Anglo-Saxons, William the Conqueror founded a monastery on the site of the battle. The monastery remained active until Henry VIII broke with Rome and sold off church lands to refill his purse after frittering away his inheritance.

The Humanities Department has many more trips planned for later in the term (the Year 7s are out again later this week in fact), but we are hoping for a little less rain on future outings!






### **Dazzle Ships from Year 7**

Join our amazing Director of Sport, for a fun-filled session, giving your little one a chance to run, jump, hop, skip, catch and throw, while developing their sporting skills.




#### Messy Monkeys - Monday, 8.45am - 10am
