

Year 8 visit to Hastings County Court - Wednesday 28th June

'Send him down!' This was the verdict given on the case of a certain member of 8G (Charlie P) who stood accused of 'stealing' the Court Officer's lunch. The hapless defendant was cross-examined by two venerable judges; Judge V and Judge A who stepped out of their traditional roles to play two opposing barristers in the case. After a fairly severe grilling, sentence was passed, with the accused being ordered to supply one bar of Toblerone chocolate and an apology to the traumatised victim.

On Wednesday, eleven members of 8G descended on the County Court in Hastings where they were treated to a fascinating glimpse of life inside this rather impressive building. Having been frisked on entry (where several items such as yo-yos and conkers were confiscated), the children were escorted down to the prison cells. Here, after handcuffing Patrick L, the prison officer allowed the group to inspect the cells and 'facilities'. They were also given permission to set off the alarm system. Unfortunately, this then became jammed and there were several tense minutes while the security officers struggled to switch it off before a full-scale evacuation of the entire courthouse was called; fortunately the 'off' switch was found just in time.

The next hour was spent sitting in various court rooms, participating in some very realistic role-play activities and finally being allowed to witness a Magistrate's court that was actually in session. Hearing the formal language used, observing the protocol of courtroom procedures and seeing the level of intensity afforded to every detail of a hearing was compelling. The children behaved impeccably throughout and luckily all made it back to Vinehall in one piece without anyone being detained!

I would like to extend huge thanks to Judge Venn and the team at Hastings County Court for giving up so much of their time to accommodate our pupils, giving them a lively, memorable and valuable insight into a completely different world.

As part of activities week, the Year 5 pupils harnessed the power of the sun by creating Cyanotypes.

They selected and placed a variety of found objects onto photo-sensitive paper to create an interesting composition. The initial compositions were created on regular paper as a practice run. Once the paper was exposed to the sun, the objects would block the light and activate the developer. The pupils had to judge their exposure times and had to rinse their creations promptly to stop them developing.

Working outside means reading the weather and ironically the sun went in on the first attempt. Luckily we tried again and it worked!



I would like to take this opportunity to thank Laura Percy-White for all her efforts in putting the programme together and Jon Newman for his energy and passion for everything athletics.


















