PRIZE GIVING







What a wonderful experience we had in France with Year 7 - a week full of French language, good food, fascinating visits, historical sites, friendship, fun and making memories.

Early on Monday we headed off to Newhaven for the ferry to Dieppe. Our crossing was smooth, and the children were excited to wave goodbye to the Seven Sisters, as they kept a look out for the white cliffs of Normandy. En route to our destination of Soignolles, we visited the pretty harbour of Honfleur where we all enjoyed a ride on the carousel. Our accommodation was a converted farm, with peaceful surroundings and comfortable rooms. Meals were delicious, homemade from local ingredients and our hosts made us very welcome.















Each day our Tour Director Caroline took us to interesting places and explained things clearly in French. It was super to see the children's confidence and comprehension develop during the stay. We shopped in the market at Villedieu-les-Poeles, and a supermarket near Bayeux. We visited Mont St Michel, a Unesco World Heritage site, celebrating its millennium this year. The crêperie at the beauty spot Les Roches de Ham was a treat on the way back, but difficult decisions had to be made over which crêpe topping to choose. I recommend the Norman beurre salé!

Many of our visits were to historic sites connected to the Norman Conquest of 1066 or the D-day landings in 1944. This links with our Humanities curriculum and really brought Year 7 History to life. We went to British and American war cemeteries, the landing beaches Gold and Omaha, to the Pegasus Bridge museum, the Bayeux Tapestry, Bayeux cathedral, the château de Caen, and Dives-sur-mer, the departure port for William the Conqueror's fleet before the Battle of Hastings.















For many of us, one of the most enjoyable visits was to La Saffrie, a goat farm where they produce milk, chocolate, soap and cheese. Everyone loved stroking the goats, and Henry learnt to milk one. The farmer spoke only in French and I was very proud when he remarked on the strong level of French shown by the Vinehall pupils. After the farm came the highlight for the adventurous members of the party; a ride on the Normandie Luge, a sort of roller coaster under an impressive viaduct. Even those who felt nervous were encouraged to face their fears and have a go. Every child ran straight back around for the rest of their rides and had an amazing time whizzing down the track.

Many thanks to Becky Prior and Marcus Peters who accompanied this memorable week. We had a fantastic time and I hope your children will tell you all about it - en français!.


Congratulations to our talented musicians who all passed this term's Associated Board Exams with merits or distinctions.

The Great House Race










The Great House Race was hotly contested, with the leading House changing throughout. In the end, Ruston stormed ahead in the final lap of the running track.




The Soccer School is open to all children aged 5-13. Places are limited and early booking is advised.


